Children and Families Rights

Pursuant To KRS 199.898

(1) All children receiving child care services in a day-care center licensed pursuant to KRS 199.896, a family child-care home certified pursuant to KRS 199.8982, or from a provider or program receiving public funds shall have the following rights:

- a. The right to be free from physical or mental abuse:
- b. The right not to be subjected to abusive language or abusive punishment: and
- c. The right to be in the care of adults who shall meet their health, safety, and developmental needs.

(2) Families, custodian, or guardians of these children specified in subsection (1) of this section shall have the following rights:

- a. The right to have access to their children at all times the child is in the care and access to the provider caring for their children during normal hours of provider operation and whenever the children are in the care of the provider;
- b. The right to be provided with information about child-care regulatory standards; and how to file a complaint;
- c. The right to file a complaint against a child-care provider without any retribution against the families, custodian, guardian, or child; and
- d. The right to information from the cabinet regarding any type of licensure denial, suspension, or revocation of an operator, and cabinet reports that have found abuse or neglect by any child-care provider or any employee of a child-care provider. Identifying information regarding children and their families shall remain confidential;
- e. The right to obtain information from the cabinet regarding the inspections and plans of correction of the day-care center, the family child care home, or the provider or program receiving public funds within the past year; and
- f. The right to review and discuss with the provider any state reports and deficiencies revealed by such reports.

(3) The child-care provider who is licensed pursuant to KRS 199.3896 or certified pursuant to KRS 199.8982 shall post these rights in a prominent place and shall provide a copy of these rights at the time of the child's enrollment in the program. Effective: 7/15/1998

This handbook is prepared for the families of all students in the preschool. It is designed to explain the programs, and demonstrate how you can help your child make initial and continuing adjustments to preschool.

Mission Statement

West Broadway Baptist Church/Rainbow Nursery School is a Christ-centered preschool that provides early education opportunities for the sake of fulfilling the church's God-ordained role in carrying out the Christian education mandated in Deuteronomy 6:7, Proverbs 22:6 and 2 Timothy 3: 15-17 (quoted below). Our goal is to assist in educating our children emotionally, academically, socially, and spiritually in a safe, healthy, and happy Christian environment.

Philosophy

Moral and Spiritual – To help the child:

1. Become aware and know that God loves and cares for them.

2. Lay the groundwork for a personal and lasting relationship with Christ.
3. Develop an attitude of kindness, cooperation, courtesy, and helpfulness toward others.

Social - To help the child:

1. Grow in ability to work and play with others.
Play is the work of children. Play allows children to learn. Learning is fun!
2. Respect personal and property rights of others.
3. Develop an attitude of kindness, cooperation, courtesy, and helpfulness toward others.
4. Accept appropriate individual and social responsibility in their group.
5. Build problem- solving skills.

Emotional - To help the child:

1. Gradually mature in emotional responses and self-discipline.
2. Properly express emotional responses.
3. Become progressively independent.
4. Develop self-confidence.

Mental - To help the child:

1. Develop a love for learning.
2. Develop independent thinking, draw conclusions, and make choices.
3. Broaden his/her range of interest.
4. Develop his/her language powers and encourage self-expression.
5. Grow in an ability to concentrate.
6. Encourage creativity.
7. Improve his/her cognitive skills.

Physical - To help a child:

1. Participate in a variety of both fine and gross motor activities.
2. Establish desirable health habits.
3. Know and follow simple rules of safety.

Your Child's Day

Rainbow Nursery School promotes pro-social activities. Each day the schedule offers a wide variety of activities that include rhythm, music, art, literature, physical education, and creative movement, and Minds-in-Motion. Our curriculum also includes play, play belongs to childhood. As children play they experience the joy of learning and become more mature as they model adult behaviors. **Each class run at different times due to COVID-19 regulations.** The class schedules are on our website. All PreK (4-5 year olds) will be required to bring a lunch/bottled water. All other classes will be required to bring their own snack (something easy to open for that age group), along with a labeled bottle water.

Progress Reports

Progress reports will be issued twice during the school year. Reports will come home the second week of school in January and the last week of school in May. Conference days will be held in January. Teachers are available via phone or email only this year.

Your Child Will Need

1. Clothes suitable for playing, painting, and sitting on the floor.
2. Clothes appropriate to the season and the day.
3. Clothes (especially removable clothing) bearing your child's name.
4. Season appropriate spare clothing in the event of an accident. Please bring in a Ziploc bag, labeled with child's name
5. Appropriate shoes for both the weather and play. No flip flops please!
6. NO BACKPACKS THIS YEAR DUE TO COVID-19

School Policies

Eligibility: As previously noted, West Broadway Baptist Church and Rainbow Nursery School follows the Statement of Faith presented in the Baptist Faith and Message 2000 (<http://www.sbc.net/bfm2000/bfm2000.asp>). We will also follow the State Department of Education guideline for Kindergarten stating that a child must be five years old before August 1 to enter school. We will follow these guidelines for all programs.

Withdrawal: Rainbow Nursery School reserves the right to place your child on a waiting list, should you have to start the school year late, or leave in the middle of the year. If at the start of the year, spots are available, the committee and director will make a decision based on availability.

It is your responsibility to pay for a full year of tuition, which consist of 10 monthly payments, unless an unforeseen circumstance should occur. It is then up to the Rainbow Nursery School Committee to make an executive decision on an appropriate action based on the family circumstance. As a place of business, the school needs to be financially set for teacher and child ratio.

The school reserves the right to remove a child from the program if the child is unable to adjust and function within the program. The school also reserves the right to remove a family if they are not following the guidelines/regulations of the CDC, Healthy at School Guidelines, and Rainbow Nursery guidelines.

Right of Dismissal: Rainbow Nursery School reserves the right to dismiss a child due to non-compliance of the policies by the Families. The child will be dismissed at the Director's notice. In extreme circumstances, immediate dismissal will be given at the discretion of the director. Refer to fee schedule of this handbook for financial obligation for dismissal. The program always reserves the right to dismiss a child if circumstances warrant.

Immunizations: Kentucky licensing requires that each child has a current immunization certificate on file in the school office within 30 days of enrollment. At the end of 30 days, children will not be allowed to attend Rainbow Nursery School until the required immunizations are on file in the school office. Updated certificates should be provided to the program as children receive further immunizations.

Birthday: This is a special day in a child's life. We will celebrate everyone's birthday at some time during the school year. We will NOT BE PERMITTED to share bday snacks this year. We will sing to the child and do a special gift from our treasure box for them.

Holidays: We will celebrate special days for Fall Festival, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Valentine's, and Easter.

Toys: Children should not bring toys, electronic media, or books to school unless it is a scheduled Show and Tell Day. This is to protect you. Due to our current circumstances, nothing should be brought to school from home.

Discipline - The goal of Rainbow Nursery School is to teach children self-regulation. The guidance techniques used are based upon the developmental level of the child, and include: positive reinforcement, redirection, and helping the children solve their own problems. Children are made aware of expectations through the consistent use of clearly defined limits. No physical or harsh verbal discipline will be used.

Communication: This preschool considers it essential for the home and school to work as partners to encourage the maximum growth in all areas of your child's development. If for any reason you wish to talk with your child's teacher or the director, send a message via email or the Remind App. The Rainbow Nursery School email is RNSpreschool@gmail.com.

We will utilize the Remind App as a communication tool and each family will be asked to participate in this service.

Teachers cannot accept verbal messages from children. Please email or telephone the school office 502-495-2489 if you have any questions or concerns. You may also email us at RNSpreschool@gmail.com.

Each class will have a monthly calendar to keep you informed of daily activities which will be delivered electronically at the start of the month.

Families will not be permitted in the building unless they are picking their child up due to illness. This is for the safety of all of our students, teachers, and families.

Temperature Checks and Medical Questions: Each day your child attends school, they will be required to have their temperature taken before entering the building. If the temperature is over

100.4, you will be asked to take the child home. The Director will also ask daily questions as to how your child has slept, any unusual activity, how they have been feeling, etc. If you refuse any of these, you will be asked to leave. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** Should your child become ill at school, or show any signs of illness, you will be called and be expected to pick your child up within the hour.

Arrival and Departure: All children are expected to participate in carpool so they can be securely checked into the building. The children will enter and exit the building at the door on the East side of the building with the overhang. It is imperative that you pick your child up on time due to current situation. If you know you are going to be late, it is a requirement that you send a message to the Director via Remind. Continued tardiness in picking up children may result in dismissal from the program.

Enter the parking lot at the first entrance off Historic Drive and go around the sanctuary of the church. Pull up even with the carpool door with the overhang and form a single line for carpool. Please have your carpool number in the window where the teacher on duty can see it. Your child will be assisted into and out of the car each morning and afternoon. Your promptness each day will be appreciated. Children arriving in the morning after their designated carpool time has ended will need to send a message via Remind, pull around and wait for other classes to unload, and wait until the Director tells you to come back through the line.

Car Seats: All children must arrive and depart from Rainbow Nursery School in an approved car seat. **No child** will be released to travel in car without an approved car seat.

Walk In: THERE WILL BE NO WALK INS ALLOWED THIS YEAR DUE TO NEW REGULATIONS

Changes in Drivers: If your child is to go home with another child or anyone other than the regular driver, the school must be notified in writing, in advance. In the event of any emergency, call the director with complete details and information regarding the change of driver. A current photo ID must be presented if someone other than the regular driver is picking up your child. For the safety of your child, this policy must be observed for each change.

Inclement Weather/Make Up Days – School Schedule: The school will follow the Jefferson County School System calendar for holidays and snow days. If schools are closed, Rainbow Nursery School will be closed. If schools are operating on a delayed schedule, Rainbow will be closed. If more than two days are missed for any program, makeup days will be noted on the school calendar.

Registration/Activity Fee: This charge is paid by all students to cover the cost of supplies. This fee is non-refundable.

Tuition: Tuition rates are based on a 10 month schedule and are due on the 1st of each month beginning in August and running through May. There is a **\$ 20.00 late fee for all payments received after the 10th of the month.** Failure to pay late fees by the end of any given month will result in the automatic withdrawal of the student. Re-instatement is based upon full payment of outstanding fees and the availability of space. Checks are to be made payable to Rainbow Nursery

School. Any returned check fee is the responsibility of the check writer and will be based upon current bank charges. All payments can be made via Credit Card machine, over phone or in carpool line. If you have to send a check, it must be mailed to the school!

Rates vary according to programs. Please see the website for more details.

Accidents or Emergencies: In case of an accident, your child will be given first aid and you will be notified. If it is a life-threatening incident, proper emergency procedures will be followed. Your child's registration form should be UP TO DATE AT ALL TIMES including the physician's name, phone number and hospital of preference. Please be sure you have completed the emergency medical treatment portion of your child's registration form. Up to date contact information for both families as well as an alternate contact person are vital.

Policy for Custody Dispute: Children will only be released to adults listed on the registration form. In case of a custody dispute, the center will not undertake the decision of legal and physical custody of a child, but will rely on the information provided by the enrolling Families. Copies of legal documents regarding custody will be maintained in the child's file.

Fire, Tornado, Earthquake: Each month the program will have a fire drill to familiarize children and staff with proper exit procedures. Quarterly tornado and earthquake drills will be held as well. In the event of severe weather, it is safer for both families and children to remain where they are at the time of the alert. The program has established safe places within the building for all children to go in the event of such an emergency.

In the event of complete evacuation of Rainbow Nursery School and the surrounding area, the children will be transported to the designated location(s) in our emergency plan **Families will be notified via REMIND app as to our location and pickup procedures.**

Lock Down: In the event a situation arises calling for lockdown. The program has procedures that will be followed. **Families will be notified of a lockdown once the situation has been resolved via REMIND app.**

Access to Facility: In order to maintain the safety of our children, staff, and families; Rainbow Nursery School reserves the right to have anyone removed from the property or facility that is perceived as risk to our children.

Licensing: Rainbow Nursery School is licensed by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services. The center has also been inspected and by the Jefferson County Division of Public Health and the State Fire Marshal's office. We are currently licensed for 107 children.

Curriculum: Age appropriate units have been established for each age group. Curriculum is planned for the month and families will receive a calendar indicating the themes and concepts

being worked on each month. Curriculum calendars and daily schedules will also be posted in each classroom and available via the REMIND app

Snacks: Each child is required to bring their own snack/labeled water bottle. We encourage you to pack healthy snacks that encourage children to make wise choices for a lifetime of good habits and healthy eating. Licensing requires that a snack include two of the following components: low fat or skim milk, protein, whole or enriched grain, fruit, and a vegetable. Water is served instead of juice to reduce the children's exposure to sugary drinks.

Health and Attendance Policies

Your child's safety and well-being is important to us here at Rainbow Nursery School. In order to keep illnesses to a minimum please take note of the following information.

Illness: Children with any form of illness should remain at home, including consistent cough, diarrhea, low grade fever, lost of taste or smell, congestion, etc. If a child shows any signs of illness, you will be asked to take them home. Each child will have their temperature taken prior to entering the building, along with the Director asking the parent a few health related questions. Please see the COVID-19 regulations posted on our website. Print these out and hang them on the fridge! If returning from quarantine, or a diagnosis of any kind, **A DOCTOR'S NOTE WILL BE REQUIRED**

Medication: The program will dispense medication prescribed by a physician if the medicine is in the original container and has clear instructions. Medication is given only when the medication permission form has been completed daily and signed by the family. Medication permission forms may be obtained from the Director. The program is not allowed to dispense over-the-counter medication without a doctor's note indicating dosage.

Please keep your child home if there are any type of symptoms that warrant concern. Below are signs that you or your child could be infected with COVID-19

COVID-19 Symptoms

Most common symptoms include:

- Dry cough
- Fever
- Tiredness

Less common symptoms:

- Aches and pains
- Sore throat
- Diarrhea
- Conjunctivitis
- Headache
- Loss of taste or smell
- a rash on skin, or discoloration of fingers or toes

Serious symptoms:

- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Chest pain or pressure
- Loss of speech or movement

Please keep your child at home to monitor if they should experience any of these as well. We will all appreciate each family going above and beyond to keep one another germ free!

1. Acute cold, coughing, sneezing, and/or runny nose.
2. Sore throat/Earache/Headache
4. Skin eruptions or rashes
5. Nausea and/ or vomiting

If your child will not be attending school on any given day, please call the school office at 495-2489, or send a message via the Remind App. Please do not send messages via Facebook or email so that we are aware of your child’s absence in a timely fashion!

For all other communicable diseases, please follow the guidelines below and contact your pediatrician immediately if you see unfamiliar behavior in your child. Doctor’s notes will be essential for this upcoming school year.

DISEASE	INCUBATION PERIOD	RETURN TO SCHOOL
Chicken Pox	7 - 21 days	When all pox marks are scabbed over
German Measles	14- 28 days	One day after rash completely disappears
Pink Eye		When eyes are free from discharge
Impetigo	2 - 5 days	When child is under doctor’s care
Head Lice		When child has a Dr’s note stating he/she is nit free

We ask that you carefully follow all procedures outlined above. We feel this is the best way to ensure the health of all the children attending Rainbow Nursery School. **If a child should become ill while at school the family or an emergency contact person will be notified and the child will need to be taken home within one hour of receiving a call.**

Sample Daily Schedule

This is a sample schedule; actual schedules vary by age group and class.

- 8:25 - 9:10 Children taken to assigned classrooms
- 9:00 - 9:30 Designated play areas for small group
- 9:30 - 9:50 Circle Time (calendar/weather/story/ etc)
- 9:50 - 10:05 Bathroom/handwashing

- 10:05 - 10:30 Snack/handwashing
- 10:30 - 11:00 Outdoor play time/designated transition (outside/gym/common area/sidewalk chalk)
- 11:00 - 11:15 Restroom break
- 11:15 - 11:45 Lunch time for PreK/craft time for other classes
- 11:45 - 12:00 Dismissal for 2's, along with hand sanitizing/wash hands for other classes
- 12:00 – 12:30 End of day activities (complete class time activities, story, units)/3 year old dismissal
- 12:30 – 1:00 Structured work for PreK (worksheets/writing/etc)
- 1:00 – 1:30 Clean/end of day review/wash & sanitize hands/Carpool

Skills and Concepts

The following is a list of skills and concepts that all classes will be working on this year. At the same time we will be working to develop a “positive self image” and good social behavior with peers in a loving and caring atmosphere.

2-Year Olds

Biblical Application Children will participate in devotions, prayers, and Bible stories.

Numbers Introduce 1 - 5 through games, songs, and hands-on activities.

Colors 8 basic colors: red, blue, green, yellow, orange, purple, brown, and black.

Shapes Introduce the 4 basic shapes: circle, square, triangle, and rectangle through games and puzzles.

Small Motor Skills Improve hand coordination through play. Use a variety of materials, play “finger plays” and coloring.

Large Motor Skills Involve children in activities such as running, hopping on two feet, and climbing.

Language Arts Improve language skills through play, listen and discuss stories, and become aware of general body parts

Weather/Seasons Introduce the concept of what we wear and why. Introduce characteristics of weather, wind, rain, snow, and sun.

Arts & Crafts Make simple crafts and participate in activities using a variety of materials.

3-4 Year Olds

Biblical Application	Children will participate in devotions, prayers, and Bible stories.
Numbers	Begin to recognize numbers 1- 10 and simple counting of objects.
Colors	Begin to recognize and name eight colors: red, blue, yellow, green, orange, purple, black, and brown.
Shapes	Begin to recognize and name four shapes: circle, square, triangle, and rectangle
Alphabet	Begin to recognize and name upper case letters, And recognize his or her name.
Small Motor Skills	Improve eye hand coordination with “finger plays”, cutting, painting, molding, and building.
Large Motor Skill	Involve children in activities such as running, jumping on one and two feet and climbing.
Language	Encourage child to speak and enunciate clearly for age, use “finger plays”, begin recognizing some upper case letters of the alphabet, recognize own name, become aware of “opposites”, use manners, and know general body part names.
Weather/Seasons	Be aware of what we wear, seasonal characteristics of animals, days of the week and some months.
Arts/Crafts	To work in a group and individually with aid from the teacher using a variety of colors and materials.

4-5Year Olds

Biblical Application	Children will participate in devotions, prayers, and Bible stories.
Personal	Tell their first and last name: write his/her first name.

Knowledge	Tell a parent phone number and home address.
Numbers	Identify numbers and count from 1 - 20 by grouping into sets, simple addition and subtraction, and matching the correct number to a set of objects.
Colors	Identify ten colors: red, blue, yellow, green, orange, purple, pink white, black, and brown.
Shapes	Identify six shapes: circle, square, triangle, rectangle, oval, and diamond.
Alphabet	Recognize all the letters of the alphabet, including upper and lower case and beginning phonics.
Small Motor Skills	Master cutting with scissors, holding a pencil and crayon correctly, mold with clay/play dough, piecing together puzzles, tracing inside and outside of a stencil.
Large Motor Skills	Master running, jumping, hopping on one and two feet, climbing, and skipping. (Skipping is not always possible until age 5 or 6)
Language Arts	Speak and enunciate clearly for age, use "finger plays" and rhymes. Recognize all upper and lower case letters, recognize their name, know "opposites", see "likeness" and "difference" in objects, know the meaning of "est": words (longest, shortest), use manners, and know general and specific body parts. Listen to and recall details in stories. Point out the front and back of a book and turn pages from left to right. Have conversations with other children and adults.
Weather and Seasons	Know what we wear, seasonal characteristics of animals and what they do. Know days of weeks and begin to know months of the year.
Arts and Crafts	Show originality and creativity by independently using a variety of colors and materials.
